Significance


- Skin integrity

- Multiple evidence-based strategies
 - Skin inspection upon admission
 - Hourly rounding
 - Hand-off reports
 - Organizational reporting and benchmarking
 - Staff education
 - Incorporation into EMR
 - State of the art beds & use of overlays as appropriate



Solution Development Strategy & Implementation

- Implementation of additional best practices
 - Mystery shopper reward program
 - HAPU monitoring board in ICU
 - Daily rounding by CNS
 - Change of shift skin inspection
