Background

Health care workers at the University of Wisconsin Hospital and Clinics (UWHC) who handle patients have little guidance to help them identify when to use the existing equipment for moving patients. Manual lifting of patients continues despite equipment installation and training. Therefore, health care workers on the inpatient care units are frequently injured from patient handling tasks.

Purpose

The purpose of this project is to decrease the number and severity of health care worker injuries on one inpatient care unit at the University of Wisconsin Hospital and Clinics by implementing a culture of safety for safe patient handling.






Materials & Methods

A multi-component safe patient handling program was deployed on an early adopter unit at UWCH with the following components:

- state of the art equipment for patient handling;
- education and training on risk assessment, patient assessment and equipment;
- unit based ergonomic assessment;
- patient handling assessment criteria;
- guideline on safe patient handling;
- visible support from leadership;
- unit based SMART champions;
- •providing after action event reviews; and
- •the use of data to analyze effectiveness of the program.




Results

UWHC Early Adopter Unit Direct Cost for Patient Handling Injuries



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Conclusions

Eight months after implementing the safe patient handling program, there has been a reduction in the volume (75%), cost (76%) and severity of injuries related to patient handling (92% in lost work days and 100% in restricted work days).
