

Sleep Safety for Pediatric Inpatients: A Quality Improvement Success Story

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Background Issue

- Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS) is the leading cause of death for infants 1-12 months of age in the United States.
- Infants are cared for and discharged from many inpatient environments, often with inconsistent sleep safety practices.
- A multidisciplinary work group at the UICH was organized to evaluate and improve the safety of the sleep environment for infants across all our inpatient settings.

Goal

 To evaluate and improve safe sleep practices among inpatient infants at UI Children's Hospital.

Methods

- Data Collection: Our workgroup created a before-and-after observational survey administered by bedside nurses.
- August 2013: Baseline data collection
- August 2014: Follow-up data collection after focused education and product implementation
- August 2015: Two year follow-up data collection
- Population: All infants < 12 months of age asleep in cribs
- Setting: UI Children's Hospital inpatient units
 - Mother Baby Unit
 - NICU and PICU
 - Pediatric units (2JCP and 3JCP)
- IRB: Reviewed by the University of Iowa institutional review board and determined not to constitute human subject research.

Interventions

- Staff and Parent Education
- Education module and live safe sleep training in September 2013, August 2014 and March 2015
- Discussed project at pediatric faculty lunch and distributed by email to residents
- Laminated crib cards at bedside for parents and staff
- Safe sleep screen saver on bedside computers
- Computer module and handouts for parents



Interventions Continued

- Products
- Sleep sacks for infants on all units
- Bedside storage containers
- Fitted crib sheets on all units

Results



- Significant reduction in number of infant cribs with unsafe objects (p=0.029)
- Objects found in sleeping infants' cribs
- Loose blankets
- Sleep positioners
- Thermometers
- Bulb syringes
- Washcloths
- Diapers and Wipes
- Clothing
- Boppy pillow
- Unsafe sleep positions
- Prone
- Side-lying

Conclusions

- Unnecessary objects were often found in sleeping infants' cribs in our inpatient setting
- Unsafe sleep positioning was common among inpatient infants
- Our quality data shows a significant decrease in the percentage of in-hospital infant cribs with unsafe objects. We continue to work towards improvement.
