
Implementing TeamSTEPPS in a Long Term Care Facility





Problem

Long Term Care (LTC) population is especially vulnerable to adverse effects from lack of teamwork

Falls

Pressure ulcers

Medication errors

Although TeamSTEPPS has developed a LTC version, there is little information about it's implementation in the LTC setting

Purpose

The goal of this project is to implement TeamSTEPPS in a LTC facility to improve patient safety outcomes

Teach TeamSTEPPS constructs and tools and implement them in the care environment

Review of the Literature


Interprofessional practice can improve patient safety (Slater, Lawton, Armitage, Bibby, & Wright, 2012)

Positive outcomes in collaborative team behaviors related to delivery of patient care in ED, OR, mental health (Reeves, Perrier, Goldman, Freeth, & Zawarenstein, 2013)

TeamSTEPPS implementation in OR, ED, OB settings with improvements (AHRQ, 2014)

APRN as team member and educator


